How we teach English

Discovery Summer programmes are intensive and designed to give you maximum opportunities to improve your English. We want you to get involved in your classes and activities so as to become confident in using English in a variety of different situations.

English Skills. On arrival you will be tested, graded and placed in a class at the appropriate level. Our curriculum is based on the Trinity Exam in Spoken English. Our structured classes will help you improve your grammar, vocabulary, reading, writing and listening skills, with an emphasis on improving confidence in spoken English. 


NON-RESIDENTIAL MORNING OR AFTERNOON COURSES

Junior levels: beginners to advanced (CEF A1 - C1) Teenagers & Adults levels: elementary to advanced (CEF A2 - C1)

Our intensive, multi-national programmes are held in one teaching building in Kensington and run from late June to mid-August. Courses start each Monday and students may study in the mornings (09.00 - 12.30) or afternoons (13.30 -17.00) for 1-7 weeks.
