

The levels



Our students

Most of our students are aged between 22 and 30, although we have a full range of ages in each class and anyone aged 18 or over is welcome to study at LITE Bayswater and Wimbledon. Each class has a good mix of nationalities to encourage a lively exchange of cultures and experiences.

The teachers

The teachers at LITE Bayswater & Wimbledon are all CELTA/TEFL qualified and provide lively, exciting lessons for their students.

Books

Students must buy a book whenever they start a new level. These can be bought from reception or any good bookstore. The average book price is £15 to £20, depending on the title. LITE will buy books back that have not been damaged or written in for £5 less than the original price. We also have second-hand books available to buy. Please ask at reception for more details.

Entry test

All students will need to take a test before they start the General English course, regardless of whether they have taken a test before. The test takes about 1 hour to complete. The teacher will then monitor the student's level in the first week and make sure they are in the right class.

Moving up a level

At the end of each term (or when you and your teacher think you are ready), you will take a level-up test to see if you can move to the next class. If you do pass, you will be automatically moved. If you do not pass the test and have to stay in the same class, you will not repeat the same book – the teacher will start a new one.

Free trial lesson

One of the best ways of finding out if the course is right for you is by seeing a lesson, so we offer all new students a free trial lesson that can help you decide. Please contact reception to arrange a convenient time for a trial lesson.

Tutorials

At LITE Bayswater and Wimbledon, we feel it is important that you get some one-to-one time with your teacher so that you can discuss any problems you are having with the course. For that reason, all English students have tutorials with their teacher at least twice each term.

Examinations

Many students like to take formal exams in order to have clear evidence of the level of English they have reached. LITE Bayswater and Wimbledon has been sending students to complete the Cambridge University UCLES examinations for many years. Students can register for the exam at the school and sit the exam in London. Special examination preparation courses are also available at LITE Bayswater and Wimbledon.

Social programme

The social programme at LITE Bayswater and Wimbledon is designed to help you practise your English skills whilst having fun with your new classmates and teachers. It also gives you a chance to see some of London and other places in the UK. The trips are arranged for the last Friday of each month and all students are welcome.

Student welfare

We know at LITE Bayswater and Wimbledon that coming to live and study in a new country can be a sometimes worrying experience. Part of our job is to help you make the most of your time in London. Our reception staff are always available and will happily help with day-to-day problems and we also have specially appointed teachers who offer welfare advice for more detailed problems.



General English Exam Preparation

The General English exam preparation course is for students who want to take the FCE or CAE examinations. The course covers examination techniques, revision of the General English course and practice examination papers.



The levels



Entry to the course

New students will be tested before they can start the course to see if they are at the right level to take the examination. Many of the students who take this course are already studying at LITE Bayswater and Wimbledon, so their teacher will recommend them.

Our students

Most of our students are aged between 22 and 30, although we have a full range of ages in each class and anyone aged 18 or over is welcome to study at LITE. Each class has a good mix of nationalities to encourage a lively exchange of cultures and experiences.

The teachers

The exam preparation course teachers are all experienced in this area of English tuition and CELTA/TEFL qualified.

Books

You will need to buy the practice test book at the start of your course. This will be available from the school or you will be able to find it in any good bookshop. The book has been chosen because it offers guidance on how to approach the exam questions and also because it includes a useful CD with practice materials, so it is therefore very good for self-study.

The average book price is £15 to £20, depending on the title.

LITE will buy books back that have not been damaged or written in for £5 less than the original price. We also have second-hand books available to buy. Please ask at reception for more details.

Terms

The General English exam preparation Course is divided into terms of 6 weeks. It will start 6 weeks before the written examination dates but the speaking exam will usually happen before the end of the preparation course. This area of the exam will therefore be covered at the start of the course. Most students find it very useful to have part of the exam before the end of the course as it allows them to get feedback on what they did from the teacher.

The courses normally start in January/February for the March exam session, April/May for the June exam session and October/November for the December exam session. As the dates of the examinations can vary, you will need to check the exact start date with reception.

Practice tests

Throughout the course you will be expected to complete practice tests, which will make up the majority of your guided self-study (7.5 hours per week). You will need to make sure you allow time to complete this self-study and find a suitable location where you will not be disturbed or distracted. There are self-study areas allocated throughout the day at both LITE Bayswater and LITE Wimbledon, which you are welcome to use.

Tutorials

Your teacher will meet with you to discuss your progress on the course. This helps you to tell your teacher about what you are finding difficult and they can give you advice about how to solve these problems.

Examinations

The University of Cambridge ESOL exams take place in March, June and December. You will need to book the exam at the start of the preparation course. The exams take place at examination centres in central London. You can book the examination at LITE Bayswater and LITE Wimbledon for an annual fee.



IELTS Exam Preparation

The IELTS exam preparation course is for students who want to take the IELTS examination. The course is aimed at students taking the Academic IELTS, but candidates for the General Training IELTS exam can also take the course and will be given individual help on General Training skills. The course covers the exam techniques needed to be successful at IELTS by focussing on key exam skills for each of the four sections tested: reading, writing, speaking and listening.

The levels

In order to be accepted on the course, students need to have an English level of FCE or above. The IELTS examination is graded from 0 (no attempt) to 9 (expert user of English), with most candidates aiming for between 5 and 7.5



Entry to the course

New students will be tested before they can start to see if they are at the right level to take the course (FCE level or above). If the student already studies English at LITE Bayswater & Wimbledon, they can be recommended by their teacher to take the IELTS course.

Our students

Most students are aged between 22 and 30, although we have a full range of ages in each class and anyone aged 18 or above is welcome. Each class has a good mix of nationalities to encourage a lively exchange of cultures and experience.

Most students who take the IELTS exam do so because they want to study at a UK university. This means that the students in each class support each other in their application process and the teacher will also help and give advice.

The teachers

The exam preparation course teachers are TEFL/CELTA qualified and will also have previous experience in preparing students for the IELTS exam.

Tutor support

Your teacher will offer individual support and guidance throughout the course. The teacher will also help you and give advice on making an application to a UK university.

Books

You will need to buy the textbook at the start of the course. This will be available from the school or you will be able to find it in any good bookshop. Most students will also buy a practice test book for individual exam practice. The teacher will recommend a selection of books available from good bookstores.

The average book price is £15 to £20, depending on the title.

LITE will buy books back that have not been damaged or written in for £5 less than the original price. We also have second-hand books available to buy. Please ask at reception for more details.

Practice tests

Throughout the course you will be expected to complete practice tests, which will make up the majority of your homework. You will need to make sure you allow time to complete this self-study and find a suitable location where you will not be disturbed or distracted. There are self-study areas allocated throughout the day at both LITE Bayswater and LITE Wimbledon, which you are welcome to use.

Examinations

You can take the IELTS examination at any time during the year. The busiest time is in the summer, so you may have to wait a little longer to get a place than at other times of the year. Normally, you should wait no longer than two to three weeks between booking the examination and actually going to sit it. You will receive your Test Report Form (results) around two to four weeks after you have sat the exam. You can register for your IELTS examination at LITE reception. There are several test centres in and around London.

The exam costs around £95, but please check this with reception as it can change depending on the test centre.
