Entry requirements

The CELTA is a University of Cambridge validated certificate. The entry requirements are:

| Age | Candidates should be aged 20 or over, but candidates aged between 18 and 20 can be accepted at the centre's discretion. |
| Education | Candidates are usually university graduates. The requirement is that candidates should have a standard of education equivalent to that required for entry into higher education. |
| English | Candidates do not need to have English as their first language, but must have a standard of English which will enable them to teach a range of levels. |

Assessment

Candidates are assessed continuously during the programme and there is no final exam. An external assessor, appointed by Cambridge ESOL, moderates each course. There are 3 components of assessment:

- **Teaching practise:** candidates teach 6 hours at two different levels and assessment is based on overall performance at the end of the 6 hours
- **Written assignments:** there are 4 written assignments: focus on the learner, lessons from the classroom, language-related tasks and resources and materials evaluation
- **Professional development:** based on the candidates overall performance on the programme.
