Teaching Practice

You'll also get invaluable teaching practice – in a safe and supportive environment. The lessons will be planned by you, but don't panic you'll be given tons of help from our very experienced, highly qualified and rather lovely tutors.

Qualification

Every part of the course must be successfully passed before you can qualify. It seems like a lot of work. It is. But it's worth it. Being a good teacher is good. But being a great teacher is, well – great.

Entry Requirements

These sound tougher than they are. But our standards are high. We want every teacher we train to be exceptional.

You must be at least eighteen at the start of the course. There is no upperage limit.

You must have educational qualifications that would permit entry into higher education. You must be able to demonstrate a sufficient level of competence in English - all skills. (If you're a non-native speaker of English, an IELTS score of 6.5 (or recognised equivalent) is essential, although this is only a partial benchmark. You'll need to demonstrate an appropriate level of competence during the selection process. You must have a level of language awareness appropriate for initial cert./under-graduate study, and language competence in English to enable students to follow the course and complete all assessed elements successfully.

You must be able to demonstrate competence in Reading, Writing, Listening and Speaking.

Application form

Once you contact us, we'll send you one.

Pre-interview task

This is designed to stimulate your interest in language and teaching. It'll help us see your strengths. (And weaknesses.) We'll discuss them at the interview.







The Interview

This is face-to-face, normally with our friendly and very talented Course Director. Here we'll discuss the nature of the course, its components, modes of assessment, intensity and the key challenges.

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


Denmark Street Guitar Shops
